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Opening Prayer

O Greatly Merciful God, Infinite Goodness, today all mankind calls out from the abyss of its misery to your mercy – to Your compassion, O God; and it is with its mighty voice of misery that is cries out. Gracious God, do not reject the prayers of this earth's exiles! O Lord, Goodness beyond our understanding, Who are acquainted with our misery through and through, and know that by our own power we cannot ascend to you, we implore You: anticipate us with Your grace and keep on increasing Your mercy in us, that we may faithfully do Your holy will all through our life and at death's hour. Let the omnipotence of Your mercy shield us from the darts our salvation's enemies, that we may with confidence, as Your children, await Your final coming – that day known to You alone. And we expect to obtain everything promised us by Jesus in spite of all our wretchedness. For Jesus is our Hope: Through His merciful Heart, as through an open gate, we pass through to heaven. Prayer during Veneration of the Divine Mercy Image

Plenary Indulgence

"The plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g., Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!).

"Additional provisions are offered to those who are impeded from fulfilling these requirements, but wish to acquire the plenary indulgence." Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy newsletter, Vol. XXXXIX, February 2003
