25 Days of Mercy



Pope Francis called for the Year of Mercy to begin December 8, 2015. There will be celebrations throughout the world as the Holy Doors are opened on this day. But this is to be an entire year where we are "called to gaze even more attentively on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Fathers' action in our lives." Use the 25 days to

keep the Year of Mercy alive in your heart throughout the year. Each of the days (not all are Sundays) are followed by a reference (#) to a teaching on mercy found in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, a scripture or liturgical year focus, and a suggested reflection or action.
